Food Banks now in MarketMaker

As of early February, food banks can now register in MarketMaker! If you are an extension agent and your county has a food bank, get them registered on MarketMaker. In addition, food businesses can now select an option if they are willing to donate food to food banks and food bank managers can search for businesses who donate.

- 1. To Register the food bank on MarketMaker, go to: ms.foodsearcher.com
- 2. For food bank managers who need to search for food using a mobile device, go to: ms.foodsearcher.com
- 3. For food businesses who want to donate food to food banks, go to ms.foodsearcher.com to search MarketMaker

What if I sell non-food AND food products in my wholesale business?

You can still register in MarketMaker! All you have to do is check the products that you produce that are food-related. One example brought to our attention was a wholesale nursery who also produces herbs and sells them as whole plants in pots. She can register her business herbs are a food product. To register her business, she needs to go to ms.foodmarketmaker.com, click on the registration tab and then follow the on-screen instructions. She will need an email address before she can register.
